



Does your child have a clinical diagnosis?

Children with clinical diagnoses (including ADHD, Autism Spectrum Disorders, Reading Disorders, NVLD, CAPD, etc.) or IEPs enrolled in Kindergarten to 3rd grade who are verbal and have normal hearing with average or above average intellectual functioning may be eligible to participate in a research study investigating how the brain processes sounds in relation to social-emotional comprehension.

Testing takes 2.5 hours and involves:

- A brief hearing screen
- Completion of web-based and computerized behavioral assessments of your child's social and emotional learning skills
- A passive neurophysiology assessment that measures the auditory brainstem response (ABR) to speech sounds

Where does testing take place?

- ABR testing must take place at Rush NeuroBehavioral Center (Skokie, IL)
- Computer-based testing may take place at Rush University Medical Center (Chicago, IL) or KGH (Northbrook, IL)

Why Participate?

- Help Advance Research: Help us learn how children with and without a range of clinical diagnoses process auditory information in relation to their other social-emotional comprehension skills.
