Location: RNBC ~ Skokie Instruction is based on the Executive Functions Curriculum developed by Dr. Georgia Bozeday and RNBC Team. It provides lesson-based activities designed to integrate sound executive function practices into general learning. These lessons will give students opportunities to see executive functions used in practical applications based on concrete examples which they successfully manage. Applying executive function principles in this manner helps students generalize these skills to other areas.

### **Objectives**

#### This workshop will:

- Model lessons from the RNBC Executive Functions Curriculum including material and time management, study strategies, initiating tasks and setting goals
- Teach task analysis and developing a study plan with an emphasis on long term projects
- Identify various study strategies including test preparation methods and note-taking options

### Who Should Attend?

Good candidates are students who are typically developing and aware that their lack of organization, time management and/or study skills is impacting their ability to perform well in school. These students are motivated and are actively seeking new strategies to help them succeed in school. Doing well in school should be a high priority for them. They should be able to sustain attention for 15-20 minutes at a time, work well with peers in small groups and be willing to share their own school experiences with the group.
