What is RNBC?

RNBC serves children, adolescents, and emerging adults with neurodevelopmental and mental health concerns. Our clinicians work closely with patients, their families, and other interconnected systems to promote health and wellness.

Who can apply?

RNBC offers a year-long training program to advanced graduate students in counseling, clinical, and school psychology PhD and PsyD programs. Applicants must hold a master's degree in a relevant field by the beginning of the training year (July 2022).

What opportunities are offered?

- Therapy with a diverse range of patient populations and clinical presentations
- Experience in clinical research, advocacy, and consultation
- Treatment using multiple evidence-based modalities, including Parent Management Training (PMT)
- Full-day clinical trainings (summer "intensive") and weekly didactics (academic year)
- Individual and group supervision
- Multidisciplinary collaboration
